On Wednesday we have our annual catering gig for Lions Club and in return we receive a donation which covers our Grade 6 jumpers.


The 150th Birthday Committee are also working hard planning and sourcing ways to fund-raise for our new Playground!





























Dartmoor Bush Nursing Centre Flu Vaccinations

It's time for annual flu vaccinations. DBNC have vaccinations available to all ages. We have appointments available Monday to Thursday 9 am to 3 pm.

You can elect to have your vaccination either inside the clinic or in the drive through under cover area. Please let us know your preference when booking your appointment.

Flu vaccinations are free for those fitting the categories below; including anyone between o and 5, with a chronic illness or over 65. Otherwise it is \$20 for members, \$25 for non members.

Flu vaccinations for children

Georgie Murrell-Maternal Health Nurse will be in the centre on the 18th May 9.30 am to 3 pm.

Georgie is able to offer free flu vaccination to all children from 6 months to 5 years and has them in stock ready to go. Phone or text her on 0488 222 821 to make an appointment.

If your are unable to make an appointment with Georgie for your child or if your child is over 5 years of age the DBNC nurses will be happy to attend to their vaccination at the clinic.

Eligibility for influenza vaccines funded by the National Immunisation Program (NIP)

Annual influenza vaccination is recommended and funded for all children aged 6 months to <5 years, and all adults aged ≥65 years.

Annual influenza vaccination is also recommended for all people aged 5 to < 65 years of age, but only funded in the following specific populations in this age group due to their increased risk of complications from influenza:

- all Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people
- people who have certain medical conditions (see Table below)
- pregnant women (during any stage of pregnancy).

Medical conditions associated with an increased risk of influenza disease complications and for which individuals are eligible for publicly funded vaccination under the NIP

Category	Medical conditions
Cardiac disease	Cyanotic congenital heart disease, congestive heart failure, coronary artery disease
Chronic respiratory conditions	Sever e asthma, cystic fibrosis, bronchiectasis, suppurative lung disease,
Chronic neurological conditions	Hereditary and degenerative CNS diseases, seizure disorders, spinal cord injuries, neuromuscular disorders
Immunocompromising conditions	Immunocompromised due to disease or treatment, aspleni a or splenic dysfunction, HIV infection
Diabetes and other metabolic disorders	Type 1 or 2 diabetes, chronic metabolic disorders
Renal disease	Chronic renal failure
Haematological disorders	Haemoglobinopathies
Long-term aspirin therapy in children aged 5	These children are at increased risk of Reye syndrome following influenza

Note: See the <u>Australian Immunisation Handbook</u> (available at immunisationhandbook, health, gov. au) for advice on people who are strongly recommended to receive annual influenza vaccination but not eligible for NIP funded in fluenza vaccines.
